FALL 2017: EMS 496/694

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION TEACHING METHODS

Students will learn how to teach environmental education to youth and adults in a variety of indoor and outdoor settings. Starting with Project Learning Tree training, students will develop the skills to plan, deliver, and evaluate environmental education programs. Students will sharpen their teaching and communication skills while learning how to educate others about important environmental concepts. Student will complete up to 40 of the 200 hours required for EE Certification.

SPRING 2018: PRT 495/595

ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION IN PRACTICE

This course will provide an overview of the environmental education profession and give students opportunities to network with EE practitioners, practice delivering programs with community partners, and build materials for a professional portfolio. Student will complete up to 80 of the 200 hours required for certification.
